- The first All Schools in 1983 had 10 boys teams and 8 girls teams in total and was held at Balmoral State High School in Brisbane.
- All Schools was the very first Junior touch event to incorporate multiple junior division 18s, 15s and 13s as well as Mixed.
- Cowboys NRL legend Matty Bowen was Player of the Final in the 18 Boys All Schools GF in 1999. His Abergowrie team defeated Mabel Park SHS.
- Current Australian Open Women's Coach, Renee

Murphy played at All Schools for Keebra Park and current Australian Men's coach Phil Gyemore, played for Harristown SHS.

 Before the "drop off" tied games at All Schools and other touch events were decided by 'the decider' which was a 2 v 1 skill challenge.

TOUCH HISTORY - THE DECIDER

Few people would know or even remember that before drop offs the decider was used.

On finishing a game the two teams would proceed to a pre marked area of the ground (it was often given the name the "Thunderdome") approx. 20m by 8 metres where 5

pairs of attackers (the coach would choose) would challenge 5 individual defenders (again chosen by the coach) in a 2 versus 1 skill activity.

The game referees would preside over this challenge and each team would have a turn of 5 attempts to score. The team with the most scores out

of 5 would win the decider. If it was still tied after 5 it would continue one for one until someone missed.

Like a drop off there was enormous pressure on players and you could imagine the crowd gathered around a 20m area cheering the combatants on.

Hammond Island (Indigenous name: Keriri or Kiriri) is an island in the Torres Strait. It has a total population of less than 300 people.

The Kaurareg people have occupied the island well before first contact with Europeans. They followed traditional patterns of hunting, fishing and agriculture, and maintained close cultural and trading ties with the Aboriginal groups of the Northern Peninsula Area of Cape York.

We asked Tamu whose favourite touch position is middle, a few questions about his experience at All Schools in 2024.

1. What was it like playing last year?

Last year was out first time going to the all schools touch carnival and it was a great opportunity for all of us. We got to experience what a large carnival was like and was crazy to see how many schools where at the carnival.

It was great meeting so many people and having the opportunity to experience so many games.

We weren't used to playing so many back to back games because of where we live. We had so much fun at the carnival and doing a heap of team activities like swimming in the ocean with waves, wet n wild and water parks.

It was also super cool because heaps of the team had never been to the Gold Coast before.

2. What is playing touch football like at school - on Tagai (some insights for city students!!)

Touch football is popular at our school and we play a lot at lunch time and in HPE. Touch football is a little different at our school because we play 'island touch' which is super similar to normal touch but slightly different rules.

When we do training we play and learn the rules for normal



touch to prepare us for the carnival.

During rainy season we don't get to play touch as much because it rains too much for us to use our school oval.

3. What preparation have you and the team been doing to prepare for All Schools?

We have been training hard 2 times a week early morning. I have to wake up super early and catch a dinghy (boat) from my Island to get to training, (I live on Hammond Island, next to Thursday Island where the Highschool is located).

THE ALL SCHOOLS DRAW

Without stating the obvious - the All Schools event is massive. The draw is an absolute nightmare for Tournament Director, Peter Bell and usually takes around 6 weeks to complete the first draft.

Here are just some of the specifics:

- There are over 2000 games to be played across 7 separate divisions
- There are 77 individual round robins occurring concurrently with each round robin usually requiring 28 games to be played
- Teams have to be placed according to geographic

location, seed or ranking, private or state education system and other criteria to ensure a good mix of schools

- There are 31 available fields and 26 time slots covering the 5 days of competition
- It is not uncommon to see upwards of 6, 7 or more draw versions due to attrition
